In early April, Jenna Persick was promoted to Library Director of Chester County Library and its Henrietta Hankin Branch. Although you may not think you know Jenna, you've most likely interacted with her, as she's been working as the CCL Business Services Librarian and in other roles since 2001!

We reached out to Jenna to learn about her 23-year tenure at CCL and what her plans are for its future. We also wanted to know what inspired her to become a librarian. And, of course, we had to know: What is her favorite book of all time? (Keep reading to find out!)

As a child, it didn't take Jenna long to become hooked on reading. When she was little, her hometown didn't have a library, so she checked out books at the bookmobile in the Kmart parking lot.

Her love of literature inspired her to pursue library sciences as a career. While in high school, she worked as library page and in college she also worked at the library. She says, "It made total sense to make libraries my career. I was happy to have an opportunity to give back to an institution that had meant so much to me growing up."

One of the biggest projects Jenna's worked on while at CCL was the creation of two separate websites for CCL and HHB. She also helped with the major redesign of chescolibraries.org that was completed last year.



As for CCL's future, Jenna wants to continue to build it up as a robust information and recreation hub for the growing Chester County community. Her dream program? Hosting regular, in-person author series at both CCL and HHB.

When asked what she loves most about her job, Jenna says, "I love our staff. We have a great group of people who are committed to providing quality service to our community." We're sure that with an amazing staff and Jenna at the helm, CCL and HHB will thrive for years to come!



The sale starts on **Friday**, **Oct. 4 from 6:00 to 8:30 p.m. for** *members of the Friends of the Chester County Library*. All Friday night attendees must have a current membership before they get into line outside the Struble Room. Place-saving using boxes, crates, etc. is not allowed.


Memberships start at \$15 for an individual and \$20 per household and can be purchased in advance by mailing in the membership form (available at the Library or on The Friends website) or by purchasing a membership at the Library's Main Checkout Desk prior to 4:30 p.m. on Friday night. There will also be a membership sign-up table beginning at 5 p.m. on Friday night. *Memberships can also be obtained online with a PayPal account. (Must be done prior to Oct. 4 to attend the Friday night sale.)*

The sale is open to the public starting on Saturday, Oct. 5 from 9:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 6 is Bag Sale Day, which takes place from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m. We supply the bag; you fill it and pay \$10. Show your current Friends membership card and pay only \$7 per bag. For less than a whole bag, the books will be sold at half-price. All proceeds from the Book Sale benefit the Chester County Library.

During this week, the book community celebrates this right, while also raising awareness and working to defend books from censorship in their communities. This year's theme is Freed Between the Lines.

Want to get involved? Go to bannedbooksweek.org to learn how you can participate! The ALA recently released 2023 book banning statistics, and they're especially eye-opening. Since 2022, there has been a 65% increase in unique titles challenged. And 54% of the challenges are directed at the collections in public libraries. Filmmaker Anna Duvernay is this year's honorary chair, and Saturday, September 28 is Let Freedom Read Day.
