We are very happy to present the 2024 Impact Report for the Chester County Library and Henrietta Hankin Branch. We are proud to serve the residents of Chester County and continue to provide new services and resources.

We welcomed Carey Bresler as the new Henrietta Hankin Branch Manager in October 2024. Carey came to us from the Oxford Library where she was the director for 12 years. Carey jumped right in and has started making connections with the Henrietta Hankin Branch community.

READ

The Henrietta Hankin Branch was one of 10 libraries that were the recipients of decodable books and training as a result of a grant sponsored by Senator Katie Muth. A decodable book is a text that helps new readers practice a specific skill that they have been taught. Decodable books follow a sequence that builds on each skill that is learned. Readers practice one skill, then learn the next.

Chester County Library provided training and selection support for this grant. Both libraries have growing decodable book collections which provide another resource to support our earliest users in their path to literacy. We were proud to work with Senator Muth and look forward to continuing to partner with local legislators in our shared mission of supporting lifelong learning.

CONNECT

We were able to expand our Next Chapter Book Club in 2024. The Next Chapter Book Club is a community-based program that welcomes adolescents and adults with Down Syndrome, autism, cerebral palsy, and other types of intellectual and developmental disabilities to discuss books in a public area of the library. The primary focus of this program is on having fun with friends in a public place on a regular basis. We now offer 3-weekly sessions (including one virtual) at the Henrietta Hankin Branch.

In 2024, we engaged with local authors and artisans with our Read Local and Holiday Craft Show Events. Read Local, held in May, showcased 33 Chester County and Pennsylvania authors and allowed the authors to talk about their books with library customers.

The Holiday Craft Show was held for the 13th time and included 50 vendors with tables throughout the library. Both events demonstrate our ability to connect local talent with our users to strengthen community.

DISCOVER

We continue to offer our popular museum pass program which allows families to visit local museums for free. We have over thirty passes available for checkout between both libraries.

We offered 2,373 programs at both libraries. These programs allow our customers free business, educational, and cultural learning opportunities.

Thank you to all of our community, volunteers, partners, and supporters. Both Libraries rely on your support and patronage, and we appreciate all of you. We are excited to continue serving our community and meeting our mission to provide informational, educational, and cultural services to the residents of Chester County. The first Chester County Library Read Local! Author Showcase was a great success, featuring local authors and illustrators across genres for all ages. Attendees enjoyed meeting authors, learning about their work, and purchasing signed books. We thank everyone who participated and look forward to making this an annual Chester County Library event.

In 2024, the "Books for All Readers" Workshop, hosted by State Senator Katie Muth and Henrietta Hankin Branch Library, shared the science of reading and strategies to support early and struggling readers. Funded by a \$125,000 American Rescue Plan Act grant announced by Senator Muth in 2022, the initiative established decodable book collections in every public library in Senate District 44 and provided training for librarians and community members.

On September 8, 2024, Chester County Library hosted its annual Library Card Sign-Up Fest, drawing families for an afternoon of free, community-focused fun. Highlights included a special story time with Senator Carolyn Comitta and a visit from Miss Pennsylvania's Teen, Arianna Spurlin. Guests enjoyed outdoor activities, entertainment, and the opportunity to give back through a book drive benefiting local youth charities. The event transformed the library's parking lot into a lively festival space.



In 2024, the beloved Tail Waggin'
Tutors program returned to the
Henrietta Hankin Branch, giving independent readers a fun and supportive way to practice their skills — by reading to a certified therapy dog.
Children enjoyed sharing their favorite books in the cozy privacy of the Youth Services Story Corner, where

our canine friends proved, once again, to be the very best listeners.

Installed in 2017, the Chester County Library's StoryWalk® in Exton Park features 20 reading stations along a ½-mile path, encouraging kids to combine reading with outdoor activity. Updated twice yearly, the project is funded by the Chester County Library Trust with support from the Pearl Foundation and was installed by Voya Financial volunteers in partnership with County departments.


In 2024, Chester County Library hosted a lively series of K-Pop and K-Drama events that drew enthusiastic participation especially among teens. From themed trivia nights to Year of the Snake celebrations with crafts, boba, and cup sleeve giveaways, each program blended pop culture, creativity, and community. Welcoming both longtime fans and curious newcomers, these events fostered connection and cultural appreciation, setting the stage for even more teen-centered programming ahead.

In 2024, the Henrietta Hankin
Branch Library launched two new
ways to connect and play. Our
Scrabble Club began on
December 5, welcoming adult word
lovers every Thursday from 12–2 pm
for friendly games and
conversation—no registration
needed. We also introduced a
board game lending collection,
perfect for family nights, with
popular titles like *Catan*, *Qwirkle*, *Ticket to Ride*, and

Taco Cat Goat Cheese Pizza available for twoweek checkouts.

On February 18, Chester County Library Exton welcomed nearly 180 patrons for a vibrant Lunar New Year celebration honoring the Year of the Dragon. Guests enjoyed Asian snacks, crafted colorful dragon masks, and gathered for the afternoon's highlight—a dynamic lion dance performance by the Penn Lions troupe. The event brought joyful energy and cultural connection to the community.



On April 8, Chester County Library co-hosted a solar eclipse event at Hibernia County Park with local partners including Chester County Parks & Preservation, the Chester County Astronomical Society and Timmy Telescope. Attendees explored eclipse science through hands-on activities, contributed data to NASA's GLOBE Observer programs, and enjoyed guided yoga sessions celebrating the sun and moon.




